Lighting of the Christ Candle and Peace Candle

One: On this first day of Lent, we gather together in the light of Christ, who walks with us through all our joys and all our sorrows.

And we gather this day in the light of our Peace Candle for, through his life, Christ taught us to live in peace with all Creation. As the congregation of Knox United, we are grateful to live in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people. We are all Treaty People committed to living together in peace and friendship with the lands, waters, and peoples of Mi'kma'ki.

Lighting of the Affirmation Candle

One: In Christ's presence, we have also lit the Affirmation Candle, and we give thanks for all the diversity in which God creates us and calls us good! In this community of faith, we celebrate that:

Welcome

All are welcome in this place.

All are welcome by God's grace.

**Call to Worship

One: Ash Wednesday is a time to center our hearts in God's presence,

All: to set down our burdens, to bring what is breaking and broken before God, and begin again.

One: As we enter this season of Lent, let us open our lives to God's presence with us through it all—

All: in life, in death, and in life beyond death, we are not alone.

One: May this love and this promise be enough for today. Come, let us worship God.

Opening Prayer

All: Gracious God, long ago, we are told, you formed every living being from the dust of the earth. Today, we remember that we are made from this beautiful dust, and at the end of our lives, it is to dust that we shall return. In our living, help us to re-discover our connection to you, to your Creation, and to each other. From this worship, create in us hearts that are open to transformation. Amen.

Prayer of Confession:

One: Through the ages of Christian tradition, Ash Wednesday developed as a doorway to speaking the truth of our lives, a time to lay the brokenness of life before God so that we might be healed over the course of Lent. As we search for healing in our lives and the life of this world, let us bring our brokenness before God in prayer:

All: There are some things I can only share with you, O God-actions and decisions that I regret, bringing my brokenness into my living. And there are some parts of our society's life that we need to share with you, O God—the brokenness that seems too big for us to repair by ourselves. I offer this brokenness to you, risen Christ, as my confession. I open myself to you, healing Spirit, asking for renewal and wisdom. Hear the prayers of my deepest self and those of my neighbours in this silent prayer.

(A time of silent prayer)

Words of Assurance:

One: Siblings in Christ, hear the good news that is given to us from the life of Christ:

Our lives are not measured by our failures and mistakes, but by the love we are given, and the love we share. And from the teachings of Christ, we are told that God, our Creator loves us beyond measure. Through thick and thin, through the joys and the sorrows, we are loved, and we are forgiven. So, let us trust in this love and forgiveness, and share it with all the world, saying:

All: We are a loved and forgiven people! Thanks be to God. Amen.

Ashes and Flowers

In a moment, we will sing our hymn "Lord, Listen to Your Children Praying" that will guide us into a time of prayer. During this time, you are encouraged to prayerfully consider what your Lenten practice or intention for Lent might be, or what you are longing for God to transform this Lent. There will be a prayer on the screen that you can pray silently or aloud to help you in your considerations.

When you are ready, you may come forward as you are able to receive the blessing of ashes on your forehead, as well as to nourish the dust of your Lenten intentions with ashes and water from the font, or raise your hand, and a worship leader will bring ashes and water to you.
