Lighting of the Affirmation Candle

One: In Christ's presence, we have also lit the Affirmation Candle, and we give thanks for all the diversity in which God creates us and calls us good! In this community of faith, we celebrate that:

Welcome

All are welcome in this place.

All are welcome by God's grace.

Call to Worship

One: The season of Lent is a time to center our hearts in God's presence.

All: to set down our burdens, to bring what is breaking and broken before God, and begin again.

One: As we enter this season of Lent, let us open our lives to God's presence with us through it all—

All: through the laughter and the tears, the glory and the imperfections, God is with us! We are not alone.

One: May this love and this promise be enough for today. Come, let us worship God.

Opening Prayer

All: Holy One, Our Refuge and Shelter, we call out to you, sometimes in praise, sometimes in distress—as life goes. Whether we perceive it or not, you are there. Open us this day to your presence in the smile of a friend, in the call of a bird—in the simple and good enough moments that fill our days. Thanks be to you, O God. Amen.

Ministry of Music: Good Enough

What in our lives do we dream about for tomorrow, void of sorrow?

Time spent regretting decisions of our yesterdays, mistakes we made?

Sometimes we get what we get,

life disappoints us and yet,

God is still here and somehow, this faith is good enough.

Prayer of Confession:

One: When I was a teenager, the Prayer of Confession often made me feel like I wasn't "good enough". I didn't love enough, or do enough, or say enough to ever make things right in this world. As I have grown older, I've come to learn that the Prayer of Confession isn't a time in our worship service that is supposed to make me feel *guilty*, its purpose is to help me look clearly at myself and my place in the world, and to make space in my life for God to make changes for the better. The Prayer of Confession isn't a time for guilt, it's a time for *transformation*.

So, let us bring our prayers of confession to God, trusting that God hears our prayers and holds us always in love. Let us pray together for ourselves, our neighbours and our community:

All: God, I am sorry for any harm I have done in words I have said or not said, and in actions I have taken or not taken. I ask the community to pray for me, even as I pray for them. (a time of silent prayer)

One: Faithful God, teach us to rest in your abundance.

All: Generous God, put in us a spirit of sharing. Courageous God, let us trust in tomorrow, and be your encouraging word in this world. These things we ask because we know they are our birthright; we ask in gratitude because we know they are already received. Amen.

Words of Assurance:

One: People of God, hear the Good News of Jesus Christ: From before you were born, God's love was with you, and long after you die, God's love will still remain with you. So, despite our sometimes faltering steps, let us trust in God's love and forgiveness, and live our lives from this moment in gratitude, saying:

All: Thanks be to God! Amen.
