Welcome

One: In the Northern Hemisphere, we find ourselves entering a time when the light fades early and coldness settles in. And yet, as the darkness grows, this is the time when we who follow Jesus light candles and lights to remind us that God's light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never and will never overcome it.

One: We light the Affirmation Candle (*Elder lights Affirmation candle*) as a celebration of all the wonderful diversity in which God creates us and calls us good! In this community of faith, we celebrate that all are welcome in this place. All: All are welcome by God's grace.

for our neighbourhood, and for our world.

All: Like Mary, we will realize that this means

food for those who are hungry

and justice for those forgotten and oppressed.

One: The Good News of Jesus' coming is here! All: Like Mary, we will go faithfully forward for the awesome Way of Jesus lies ahead.

One: Come, let us worship God.

Opening Prayer

All: Holy God, whether it's through angels or music, friendships or sermons, study or nature— when you speak, we long to hear it. In a world as chaotic and broken as ours, we could use your words of hope and healing. So, open our lives to your word this day through song and prayer, through giving gifts and the wisdom of children and youth. With gratitude we pray, Amen.

Advent Candle Lighting Liturgy:

Worship Leader: Over a hundred people, from the ages of two to eighty years old, were asked the question, "What are you afraid of?" From the voices of different generations, hear their answers:

Teen 1: Not being enough.

Teen 2: Not making enough of a difference.

Teen 1: Falling down.

Teen 2: That we will forget we belong to one another.

Teen 1: Climate change.

Teen 2: My child having to learn gun violence drills at school.

Teen 1: Spiders.

Teen 2: Not having someone to take care of me; not having someone who knows my stories.

Teen 1: My mental health slipping.

Teen 2: Ending up alone.

Teen 1: Nightmares.

Teen 2: Stopping short of following God all the way.

Teen 1: Today we light the candle of peace, because we so desperately need **God's peace** in the midst of all we fear. (Other reader lights candle)

Adult: May this light be a reminder that Christ is coming. God was with generations before, God is with us today, and God will be with us tomorrow. Even now, God is on the way. Amen.
