Announcements

Welcome

One: On this day of Thanksgiving and in this Season in the Church known as the Season of Creation, we are thankful for the abundance of God's grace bestowed upon us, and in humbleness, we realize the depth of those blessings. (*Elder lights Christ Candle*) We light the Christ candle to remind us that we are not to hide the light of Christ within the walls of a church building, but to take it out into the world so that everyone will know and experience God's love and justice.

One: We light the Peace candle (*Elder lights Peace Candle*) as a reminder that Jesus taught us to live in peace with all Creation. As the congregation of Knox United, we acknowledge that we live, work, worship and play within the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people. As those who follow Jesus' path of peace,

All: we commit ourselves to upholding the Treaties of Peace and Friendship so that we will live in a good way with all peoples, the land, the waters, and all of Creation, for we are all treaty people.

One: We light the Affirmation Candle (*Elder lights Affirmation candle*) as a celebration of all the wonderful diversity in which God creates us and calls us good! In this community of faith, we celebrate that all are welcome in this place.

All: All are welcome by God's grace.

*Call to Worship:

One: Thanksgiving.

All: It's not just a moment.

One: Thanksgiving.

All: It's not just a day.

One: Thanksgiving.

All: It's not just a season.

One: Thanksgiving!

All: Is an action, to be lived always, and to be lived all-ways.

One: Thanksgiving!

All: Is an attitude. Is a promise. Is a life.

One: So, let us enter this time

All: Giving thanks to one another, to creation, and to the Creator of All!

One: Come, let us worship God. Let us pray.

Opening Prayer:

All: God-of-All, we have set aside this day of thanksgiving because we sometimes have difficulty remembering to *live* our thanks-giving. We sometimes have difficulty remembering to *be* thanks-giving. So—thank you, for everything!

Open our hearts to realize where thanks need to be given. Open our spirits to share the words. Open our lives to be your love. As disciples of Jesus, we ask this. May it be so. Amen.

The Sacrament of Baptism

<u>Baptism Team Member</u>: In The United Church of Canada, we believe that each child born into the world is already a beloved child of God. Nothing can take that away from any of us.

Believing this, we celebrate the sacred act of baptism through which we recognize the love of God that is already working in a person's life, and we bless the person with the name and love of God and the sign of the cross on their forehead as a reminder that they are now members of Christ's family and are called to live as Christ teaches us to live—loving our neighbours as ourselves, loving kindness, and working for justice in our world.

On behalf of the **Congregation of Knox United Church**, I present Megan and Christopher Hunter who desire baptism for their **child Kevin Terrance Hunter**.

<u>Penny</u>: Megan and Christopher, the act of Baptism proclaims that you are loved by God, and that you desire to live as Christ teaches his followers to live. As parents, you make these vows on behalf of Kevin until he can claim these vows for himself. As such, I ask you these questions as a profession of your faith, and the life in which you hope to raise Kevin as your child.

Do you believe in one God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Christopher and Megan: I do, by the grace of God.

Penny: Desiring the freedom of new life in Christ, do you seek to resist evil, and to live in love and justice? Christopher and Megan: I will, God being my helper.

Penny: Will you follow the way of Jesus Christ?

Christopher and Megan: I will, God being my helper.

Penny: Will you join with your siblings in Christ in this congregation (and in Newfoundland) to share in the life, work, and ministry of Jesus?

Christopher and Megan: I will, God being my helper.

Penny: Will you share your faith with *Kevin,* growing with *him* in faith, hope, and love?

Christopher and Megan: I will, God being my helper.

<u>To the Elders</u> (*Please stand*), As **Sponsors** to this child and his family, do you covenant to give your time and yourselves, sharing your faith stories and life experiences; encouraging this **whole family** to explore a growing experience of God and self? If so, please answer: **We do, God being our helper.**

And this faith community (Please stand): Do you covenant to receive this child and all children under your care, affording them every opportunity to know Jesus Christ and grow in faithful witness to His Saving power? If so, please answer together: We will, God being our helper. (All may be seated)

<u>Elder/Baptism Team Member:</u> Kevin, receive the gift of scripture as a way to learn of the Love that was born as a child like yourself. May you share the story of this day often, that you may know you are loved and embraced come what may. Amen. (give the parents a Bible)
